

## Pharm.D. Program Quality Indicators

### Program Completion – Class of 2020

- 219 students were admitted in fall 2016 as the class of 2020; 182 (83.1%) graduated on time
  - 8 students were academically dismissed; 10 students voluntarily withdrew; 19 students will have a delayed graduation
